Bock Casemates: a UNESCO World Heritage Site

The Bock Casemates, a subterranean defence system made up of kilometres of tunnels, is today one of the most important visitor sites in Luxembourg. These underground galleries were initially carved in the 17th century, under Spanish rule, and subsequently twice extended. Visiting the archaeological crypt, the antechamber to the casemates, is a similarly remarkable experience. On account of these impressive fortifications, Luxembourg was even given the epithet of the “Gibraltar of the North”. Discover the tumultuous history of the casemates and take in wonderful views of the Grund, Clausen and Pfaffenthal districts.

City Promenade sightseeing highlights

On this two-hour city walking tour, accompanied by an experienced guide, you will discover the most beautiful sights in Luxembourg City, including the Place d'Armes, Notre-Dame Cathedral of Luxembourg, the Place de la Constitution with the Gëlle Fra (Golden Lady) memorial, the Monument of the Millennium, the Corniche (alias “Europe’s most beautiful balcony”), and not least the Grand Ducal Palace with its ceremonial guard, patrolling with military discipline.

Wenzel circular walk through a UNESCO World Heritage Site

This circular walk through time and place shows you 1,000 years of cultural and natural history. It passes through the famous Bock casemates and the Old Town, links the upper and lower parts of the city, offers breathtaking panoramic views of the fortifications dating back to the time when Luxembourg was the “Gibraltar of the North”. The walk takes you through the lush Alzette valley where you can experience the green oasis within the city and take a break for something to eat and drink in idyllic surroundings. Once you’re ready to keep going, there is a free lift to take you back up to the city centre.

Lëtzebuerg City Museum: living history of the city

This museum brings the capital's more than one thousand years of history to life: "The Luxembourg Story" is a permanent exhibition that shows the development of the city through countless original artefacts and models, some of them incorporating multimedia animations. The new UNESCO Visitor Centre fits in perfectly here and continues the same historic theme, while two further floors of the museum house temporary exhibitions. The Lëtzebuerg City Museum is housed in four historic buildings which were built between the 17th and 19th centuries, in some cases on medieval foundations. A special highlight is the vast glass lift that can carry up to 65 people at a time along the ancient walls inside the museum.

Mudam – Museum of Modern Art

Mudam is a place of sheer aesthetic delight. The building alone, designed by the Chinese-American architect Ieoh Ming Pei, is worth a visit. Mudam is a venue for all artistic disciplines, including painting, sculpture and video art. Its collections and programme – from children's workshops to after-work events – reflect current national and international creative trends. Visitors can enjoy regional specialities in the bright design café. Mudam is located right next to the historic Fort Thüngen in the Dräi Eechelen Park and blends perfectly into its historic surroundings. Permanent and temporary exhibitions are also installed in the park, from where you can admire views of the city across the valley.

The museum is located in the charming Grund district and can be easily reached via the lift from the Plateau St. Esprit or on foot along the picturesque cobbled streets surrounding the Corniche.

National Museum of History and Art

The National Museum of History and Art contains some unexpected treasures such as a mosaic from the Roman villa at Vichten dating back to 240 AD, or beautiful Art Deco items from the porcelain manufacturer Villeroy & Boch. The museum, which covers a total area of 6200m², is situated in the heart of the UNESCO-listed Old Town, between the Grand Ducal Palace and the Bock casemates, and brings Luxembourg's history to life with a series of themed tours. For example, very appropriately, the museum's archaeological collections can be admired in rooms carved into the rock face. The contemporary art rooms house works by the world-famous photographer Edward Steichen. The museum shop and cafeteria round off the cultural experience.

Dräi Eechelen Museum: Fortress, History, Identity

A fortified castle becomes a cultural centre: the Dräi Eechelen Museum is located inside the renovated Fort Thüngen, first built in 1732-33, and is right next to the Mudam, Museum of Modern Art. The museum's historic home is itself an important element in the permanent exhibition there entitled "Fortress, History, Identity". With its impressive underground tunnels and mines, the building still largely remains as it was when it was last extended in 1836/37. On a guided tour, visitors can discover over 600 objects and original documents on permanent display behind the fortified walls. On the first floor, the museum regularly presents special contemporary exhibitions.

Villa Vauban – Luxembourg City Art Museum

The Villa Vauban is located in the heart of the city, surrounded by historic parkland that is the perfect place for relaxation. The stately urban villa was built in 1873 on foundations that date back to the time when Luxembourg was a fortified town. A modern extension has been added and the building was completely refurbished in the early 2000s. The museum presents changing exhibitions based on its own collections (European art from the 17th to the 19th century and Luxembourgish art from the 20th and 21st centuries).

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Neumünster Abbey cultural centre

Nowadays, the former Benedictine abbey in the iconic Grund district of the city is an open, welcoming venue for concerts and festivals, although for a long time the large building served as a prison. Following extensive restoration, it has been a public meeting place and cultural centre since 2004. Its purpose is to strengthen Luxembourg's cultural identity and promote intercultural dialogue. The abbey offers a programme of concerts, plays and artists-in-residence as well as a range of free exhibitions that are open daily. The lovely terrace of the Brasserie Wenzel offers excellent views of the fortress. Try vegan brunch on Saturdays from 11:00 or live jazz and brunch on Sundays at 11:00. Guided tours can be arranged on request.

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MORE THINGS TO DO CAPITAL

Minor treats and major architecture

Discover the pulsating, yet simultaneously laid back green city on foot and by using free public transport, such as the modern tram. Let loose and follow your fancy to places that make your stroll an unforgettable experience. Through sprawling parks and winding valleys, over cobblestones and past unique and charming buildings from practically every era of architecture; from the Upper Town, connected by bridge with the modern Kirchberg district, to the Lower Town with its Alzette and Pétrusse rivers and the historic districts of the Grund, Clausen and Pfaffenthal.

No matter where you start your tour, delights great and small lie in store. In the **Upper Town**, you can check out the window displays in the country's most famous **delicatessens** and stock up on pralines or other sweet and savoury treats; whether shopping at Oberweis, Namur, Kaempff-Kohler or in Nathalie Bonn's Chocolate House. In fact, the Grand Ducal family is a customer at some of these prestigious, tradition-rich stores. You can also find a wide variety of products from Luxembourg in the Luxembourg House, right by the Grand Ducal Palace.

Do you always make time for a little **shopping**? In the **Upper Town**, well-known brands, attractive jewellery stores and luxury boutiques await in the area around the Place d'Armes and the famous Place Guillaume II, alias the "Knuedler", where you can also find an array of craft shops, galleries, flower shops and an ever-changing selection of pop-up stores, all located between inviting terraces, bars, iconic squares and historic buildings. The **station district** has its own special appeal and the main shopping streets here are the Avenue de la Gare and the Avenue de la Liberté. Locals delight in taking a stroll through the Upper Town and being a part of the easy-going atmosphere, for example at open-air concerts or markets on the Knuedler or the Place d'Armes.

Every Wednesday and Saturday morning on the **Knuedler**, you will find plenty more things that make life beautiful. Along with culinary specialities why not dive into the colourful goings-on of a traditional **weekly market**, including a flower market. You can find an overview of the all markets in Luxembourg City here:

Out and about at the weekend? If so, the "**Kinnekswiss**" city park is the place to have a truly relaxing time on the large lawns. In summer, many people take advantage of the free games hire service as well as the yoga and other sports that take place. In the summer months, festivals and events make the Kinnekswiss a popular evening destination too.

Are traces of the past something that appeal to you? In **Notre-Dame Cathedral** you will encounter a piece of the city's history; its crypt is the final resting place of the remains of King John the Blind. Luxembourg's biggest annual fair dates back to him: the "**Schueberfouer**", held annually in August. The cathedral itself is a building flooded with light that combines stylistic elements from the Late Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque periods. Generally, in Luxembourg's old town you will come across a wide range of building styles alongside each other. The **Jugendstil**, too, has lent its playful appeal to a number of façades, for example around the **Avenue de la Liberté**.

Do you want to get to know the **Lower Town**? Take a trip – free of charge – along the UNESCO-protected city walls in the **Pfaffenthal glass lift**. You can take in the

impressive panoramic views over the Alzette valley from the viewing platform at the top as well as throughout the journey up or down. Reaching the Pfaffenthal district at the bottom, quaint cafés, restaurants and shops are dotted around, along with the Mohrfels Mill, one of the country's oldest water mills and the former production site of the Moutarderie de Luxembourg mustard factory. The valley is spanned by the Grand Duchess Charlotte Bridge, also known locally as the Red Bridge. At weekends during the summer, you can try a historical **Urban Time Travel** augmented reality experience in Pfaffenthal and hop on a **virtual coach trip through the past**.

From Pfaffenthal, it is a short walk to the **Grund** district, which you can also reach from the Upper Town directly, taking a lift from the Plateau du Saint-Esprit. At the bottom, head over the picturesque bridge and pause to see the iconic view of the layered city. A stroll along the banks of the Alzette river, past the urban apple orchard, will take you to a bench with Melusina the water nymph seated on it, from the legend about the founding of Luxembourg. In the Grund, there are plenty of opportunities for grabbing a bite

to eat: from wine bars and Japanese specialities to casual pubs and fine dining. Whether it is **culinary delights** or **nightlife** that you are after - the bars and restaurants housed in the old factory halls of the **Rives de Clausen**, also located in the **Lower Town**, are a popular meeting place for locals and tourists. **Clausen** is home to a long tradition in the art of brewing in Luxembourg.

The **Pétrusse valley** is a wildly romantic place. Steep slopes and unusual rock formations form a harmonious whole with the ruins of fortresses and strongholds, spanned by two bridges, the Passerelle and the Adolphe Bridge. As well as the fitness park and children's play areas, Luxembourg City created a large **Skatepark Pétruss** for all levels of practice in the valley. This modern park nestles in the remnants of the old fortifications. Over a total area of 3,400m², the young and still young-at-heart have fun, skate or ride BMX; the park has a distinctive atmosphere, inviting passersby to stop and watch.

Another place where you can catch your breath is the **Dräi Eechelen park** in **Kirchberg**, around 2km away from the historic city centre.

It invites visitors to stroll amidst an interplay of modern, architectural-ly-inspiring buildings and former fortress walls. It is where people come to watch sunsets and the wonderful cityscape above the valley.

In the district of Kirchberg, with its international feel, you will find many fascinating **architectural features**: whether the impressive the Mudam modern art museum, designed by Ieoh Ming Pei, or other prominent buildings, from EU high-rise offices to banks, residential buildings, restaurants and shopping centres. Thematic guided walks focusing on architecture and art in public spaces are organised, among others, by the Order of Architects and the Fonds Kirchberg.

Outside Architecture/Art, inside Sound/Wonder: visit the striking **Philharmonie** concert hall. Musicians of international standing and the Luxembourg Philharmonic Orchestra perform here. The characteristic architecture of the building captivates passersby and visitors with its many white columns and a perfectly-matched lighting concept, designed by Christian de Portzamparc.

The various **theatres** in Luxembourg City offer a programme of national and international performances, from the intimate Théâtre du Centaure to the Théâtre des Capucins, the Kasemattentheater and the Grand Théâtre.

A very special **cultural centre** with exhibitions, concerts and markets, somewhat alternative and highly innovative, is the **Rotondes** in the district of Bonnevoie. Locals also meet up here, at the Buvette bar and restaurant, with its large colourful terrace and cool vibes.

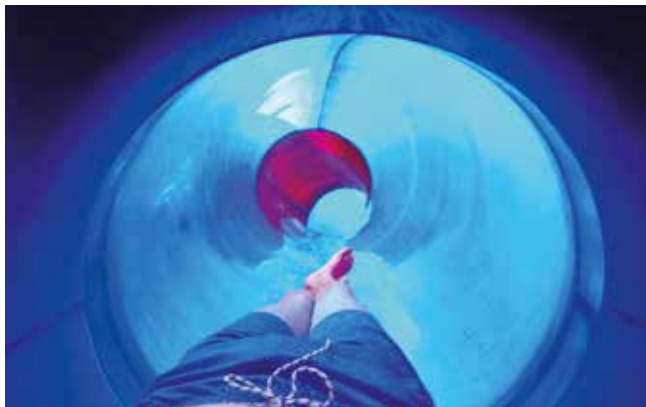

MORE THINGS TO DO GUTTLAND

Fortresses and castles, the pleasures of nature, and the rural life of yesteryear

The Guttland region, close to the country's capital city, is a popular area for local leisure pursuits, and the region par excellence for **fortresses and castles**. Nowhere else in Luxembourg are they found in such density as in the Valley of the Seven Castles, with castles in Mersch, Schoenfels, Ansembourg and Koerich, and hill-top fortresses at Hollenfels, Ansembourg and Septfontaines. Festivals and markets ensure that the old walls are regularly filled with life again. Each has its own charm and style. In addition to the seven castles in the valley itself, the nearby castle at

Useldange is also well worth a visit. You can enjoy a pleasant and pleasurable discovery of the valley from the comfort of your car, for example. Behind every corner a pleasing view, an enchanting tree-lined road or a romantic building awaits.

Do you like exploring by **bike**? Then you should explore the thematic cycling routes. The natural environment of the Guttland region is an excellent place to take life at a slower pace – the national and regional cycle routes and three circular tours in the west are an open invitation.

For **walkers** too, Guttland is a region worth exploring. Here, the emphasis is not on physical exertion, but on enjoyment and the pleasure of moving outdoors in nature, with gently winding paths through ample green spaces, past small ponds and streams.

One possible destination among many for an outing on foot or by bike is the **Beckericher Millen**, a former mill that now houses exhibitions and a restaurant and café within its historic walls and mill buildings, along with many items of farming machinery and equipment from the time when it served as a sawmill. Workshops and seminars about the way of life and crafts in earlier times are also held in the Beckerich Mill. Beckerich, incidentally, is a highly innovative and sustainable village with many projects linked to environmental protection. The region even has its own currency to boost the local economy, the “Beki”.

Anyone who loves nature and is looking for something special should get to know the **Aarnesch nature reserve** in Niederanven. Its semi-dry grasslands feature a wide variety

of orchids. **Five nature reserves** in the Guttland region invite you to learn more about various themes and aspects of the natural world; for example, birds and their young in the **Schlammwiss** nature conservation area in Uebersyren, marshlands in the **Marais de Grendel nature reserve** in Colpach, the **Pëttenerbësch nature reserve** in Pettingen (the geographical centre of Luxembourg), and the **Schwaarzenhaff nature reserve**, which lies in the Natura 2000 area of the Mamer and Eisch Valley and is part of the biggest nature conservation area of European importance in Luxembourg. The site is a habitat for rare animals such as the midwife toad and bats.

The Guttland region harbours secrets too. In the forest between Mersch and Keispelt, there is a unique cave system. The “**Mamer-leeën**” comprise natural sandstone caves and a network of man-made shafts. The system of caves and shafts extends from the “Huella” in the south for over 1km northwards, towards Mersch.

The Guttland region is not only impressive for its natural environment and its hiking trails, but also on account of its many **prehistoric and ancient sites**, which notably include many Gallo-Roman sites, such as the Roman villa in Mersch, the Gallo-Roman baths in Mamer, the Gallo-Roman aqueduct in the Helmsange forest, and the Gallo-Roman villa of Goebange. The rustic villa of Goebange-Miecher is one of the most important Gallo-Roman estates in the Trévires territory. Built at the beginning of the 1st century, it covers a fortified area of five hectares with at least seven stone buildings. Next to the luxurious mansion and the other older bourgeois house, another residential building, a small temple and three outbuildings complete the current picture. Even if these are just foundations, you can easily get a sense of it with a little imagination. If the Stone Age

fascinates you, come and take a tour of the reconstructed Neolithic village in Blaschette, visit the Celtic aristocratic tombs of Nospelt, the Merovingian necropolis of Dondelange or the impressive menhir of Mersch.

Do you want to dive into the history of **rural life in earlier times**? In small rural museums, that earlier life is on display, whether in relation to crafts or farming. Discover the different facets of Guttland's past - from the history of the Luxembourg Fire Brigade to pottery. Refresh your knowledge of rural life in the Thillenvogtei Museum in **Rindschleiden** – the **smallest village in Luxembourg** and home to an appealing and original café - or visit the Distillery Museum in Kehlen; take a look at a fire brigade exhibition in Senningen, the Geological Institute in Reimberg, the Railway Museum in Noerdange or visit the Archaeological Museum in Nospelt, where original finds from the Stone Age to the Roman period are exhibited.

Guttland is another region with very special traditions: for example, “**Émaischen**” is a folk festival held

every year on Easter weekend in Nospelt. At the heart of it are the “Péckvillercher”, fired clay pipes in the form of a bird. They are particularly popular with children and collectors. In addition to these small hand-made pipes and stalls offering a wide range of pottery, you can also look forward to concerts, workshops and exhibitions. In September, the traditional “**Kropemannsfest**” is held. Since this festival is arranged in honour of the legendary figure of the “Kropemann”, naturally he puts in an appearance at these celebrations.

Far removed from traditions and life in earlier times, things can also be totally cool and contemporary in the Guttland region. For instance, the small village of Kahler (Koler in Luxembourgish) is full of vibrant and colourful urban art that a young artist from the village has designed on house walls, barns and brick walls – under the motto: “**Make Koler Kooler**”. Residents and visitors are equally impressed that the village is becoming ever more appealing and diverse. A new cinema has also been

built, offering a daily, wide-ranging programme extending from art-house films to blockbusters.

Water Mill Museum: 1,000 years of industrial history

The oldest mill in the Grand Duchy has nearly 1,000 years of history under its wheel. It is located in Asselborn, 8km west of Clervaux in the valley of the Tratterbach stream, known as the “Valley of Peace”. It now houses a small museum showing how a mill like this used to work and what kind of tools were used here. The history of the mill can be traced back to the year 1036. The mill and the water wheel may be put into operation at the request of visitors.

Bourscheid Castle and Gothic manor house

Bourscheid Castle is Luxembourg's biggest castle, an impressive structure with its characteristic round towers. The castle was probably built in the 10th century, and then extended in the 14th and 15th centuries, when the fortress wall was added, flanked by six Gothic towers. Nowadays, audio guides in seven different languages guide visitors round the castle. There are amazing views from the castle of the whole valley around Bourscheid. In the evening, the building is illuminated, creating a fairy-tale atmosphere. The nearby Stolzembourg House is a magnificent Gothic manor house dating back to 1348.

Museum of the Battle of the Bulge: Memories of the Liberation

The Battle of the Bulge was one of the biggest and most complex battles of the Second World War. It was as a result of this battle that US General Patton, to whom a monument stands in Ettelbruck, and his Third Army were finally able to free the people of Luxembourg from the German occupation. The museum tells the story of this difficult time and keeps the memory alive of the Americans who liberated the country. Numerous documents, uniforms and weapons from the Battle of the Bulge in the winter of 1944-45 are on display here. The exhibition is in the inner courtyard of the castle.

It is a famous and moving exhibition of photographs that has been on the UNESCO World Documentary Heritage list since 2003. It is a manifesto for peace between people. The exhibition consists of 503 pictures by 273 photographers from 68 countries, including Robert Capa, Henri Cartier-Bresson, August Sander and Dorothea Lange. Curated by Edward Steichen and first displayed at the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) in New York in 1955, the exhibition has had its permanent home at Clervaux Castle since the 1990s.

National Museum for Historic Vehicles

This exhibition of vintage cars traces automotive history from the earliest days of car-making to the technology of the 1970s. It is housed in Jean Wagner's former car factory, the only historic site in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg to be associated with the car manufacturing industry. On display are vehicles from collections in Luxembourg and other countries that are typical of the different periods of vehicle construction. The museum also hosts a busy programme of conferences and events. In addition, beer-lovers and others will enjoy making a detour to another small museum in the same building – a private collection of more than 1,000 artefacts that tell the story of the Diekirch brewery.

National Museum of Military History

What sufferings did soldiers and civilians have to endure? The Battle of the Bulge was the key battle for the USA in the Second World War. At the National Museum of Military History, the fighting around Diekirch is reconstructed in large-scale dioramas, focusing on the fate of the people concerned. Also on display in the exhibition are weapons, vehicles and other military artefacts, together with numerous documents and archive photos. The museum also illustrates the history of the Resistance fighters in Luxembourg from 1940 to 1945 and the history of Luxembourg's army; there are also sections about Allied troops in the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War.

General Patton Memorial Museum Spotlight on the Battle of the Bulge

The museum is a tribute to General George S. Patton Jr. He was the commander of the Third US Army whose troops liberated the town of Ettelbruck during the Second World War, on 25 December 1944. Various photographs, documents and authentic objects illustrate the invasion, repression and persecution perpetrated by Germany and the liberation of Luxembourg in September 1944. The exhibition also tells the general's life story, displays military equipment and describes aerial warfare over Luxembourg. Anyone wishing to follow further in General Patton's footsteps can visit his last resting place in the American cemetery in Hamm on the outskirts of Luxembourg City.

Old Cloth Factory "Duch vum Séi"

A former cloth factory is home to an exhibition about the history of wool processing and cloth manufacture. Demonstrations of cloth-making are given on carefully restored textile machines that can be put into operation for guided tours on request. The exclusive woollen fabrics that are made here are available to purchase from the museum shop. The blankets, shawls, ponchos, wash bags, handbags and key fobs are only made in small numbers and are therefore unique. 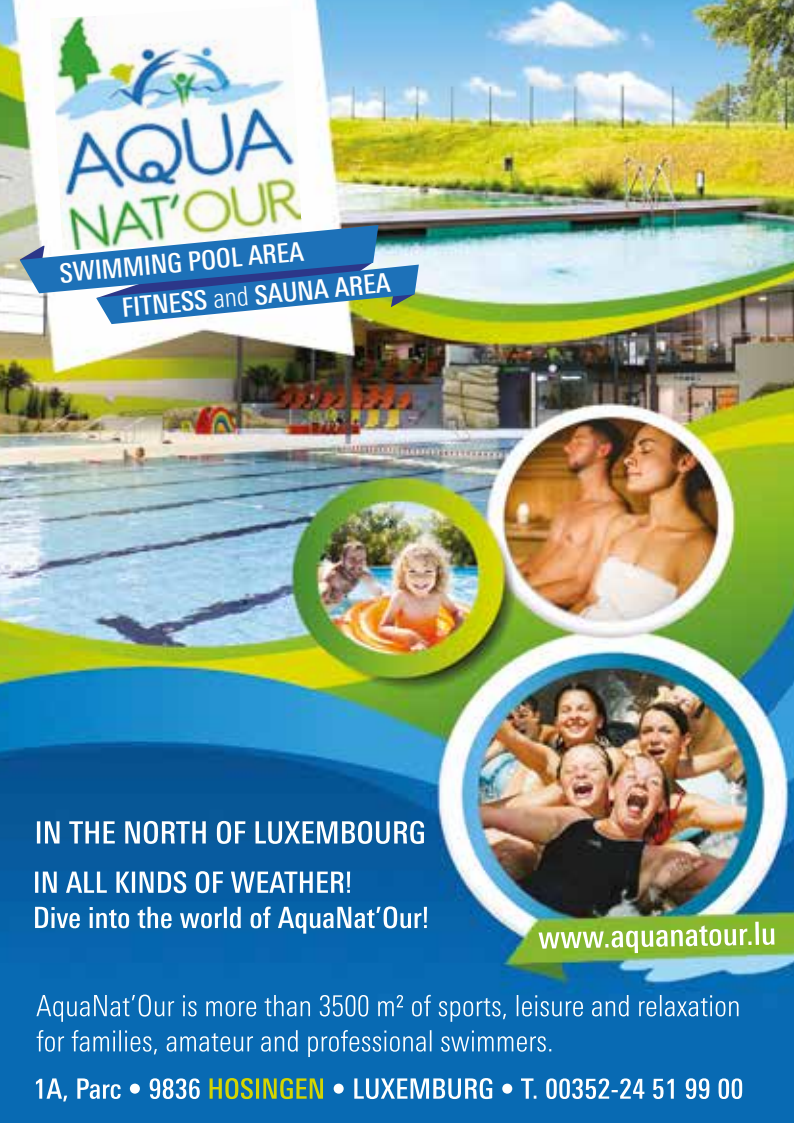

Highlights for hikers are the **Escapardenne Lee Trail**, a **Leading Quality Trail – Best of Europe**-certified route; the **Eislek Trail**, which continues the Lee Trail and extends over the northern border of the country into Belgium; and the

Nat'Our Routes, certified as “Premium Hiking Routes”. Walking from station to station is attractive and also convenient, with walking routes following the CFL rail lines.

The meeting point of the Alzette and Sûre rivers has shaped a unique natural landscape: the **Nordstad valley**, also known as the **gateway to the Éislek region**. Unpopulated hillsides and upland areas border the ribbon development of the towns. Thanks to the excellent rail connections between the Nordstad area and Luxembourg City, it is

easy and quick to reach the Éislek region. So how about a **cycling tour** through the **five municipalities that make up Nordstad**? You can hire a bike in Schieren and ride the cycle route to Ettelbruck. The CAPE Arts Centre there stages a wide variety of events. From Ettelbruck, the route continues to the castle at Erpeldange-sur-Sûre. Beyond there, the tour takes you to Diekirch, with fantastic opportunities for stop-offs and shopping. The cycle route continues along the Sûre, to Bettendorf. You can even follow the Sûre by bike via Echternach, as far as the Moselle. If you want to explore the Nordstad **on foot**, the **Adrien Ries hiking route**, at 48 km long, is the perfect circular tour to discover the beautiful views of the Éislek region.

Do you want to really immerse yourself in the nature and history of Luxembourg? Then take a **Hop On Hop Off Nature and Castle Tour**, which will take you on a journey through the Luxembourg countryside and show you the enchanting natural sights of the Mullerthal area (known as “Luxembourg’s Little Switzerland”), to Echternach, the oldest town, and the medieval town of Vianden. The tour runs on Tuesdays to Sundays, always starting at 9:30 from Avenue Monterey in Luxembourg City. Duration, including stops and visits is roughly 8 hours. The coach stops at four points on the tour: at the “Schéissendëmpel” waterfall with its impressive rock formations, at Beaufort Castle, in Vianden and in Echternach before returning to Luxembourg City.

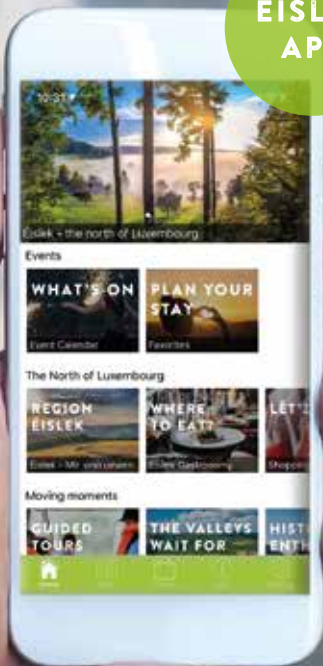

And, moreover, quite literally a fairy tale, since many rock formations bear mysterious names and are closely connected with fables and legends.

In the Mullerthal, many paths lead to Echternach. During the Hopping Procession, thousands of people dance in the town’s streets to traditional music. The Mullerthal is set to move you in many ways.

Beaufort Castles: medieval fortifications and Renaissance elegance

In the beautiful countryside of Beaufort, you can visit not one but two castles. Not far from the chateau's idyllic little lake, an impressive medieval castle towers over the scene. It was built between 1050 and 1650. Following major repairs, the imposing ruins opened to the public as long ago as 1932 and today they are regarded as a historic monument. Just around the corner, you'll find the Renaissance castle, which dates from the 17th century. The fascinating interiors bring the magic of the past to life. The castle can only be visited on a guided tour, which ends with an opportunity to taste the chateau's famous Casséro liqueur.

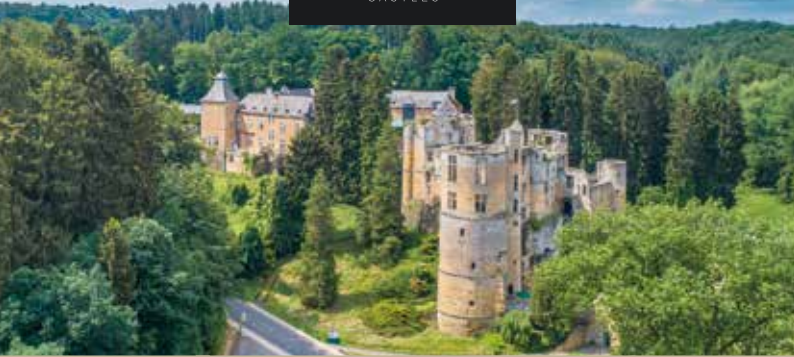

The three founders of Ramborn Cider Haff aim to revive that tradition on their modern, renovated farm. Working with growers in the surrounding area, they use over 100 different apple varieties to make ciders that sometimes have unexpected flavours like vanilla or rum, and that have won several international prizes. Museum at the Abbey of Echternach

In the Middle Ages, monks at the Echternach Abbey used to produce stunningly beautiful, elaborately decorated manuscripts that were famous all over Europe. Their story is told today in the museum that is housed in the vaulted cellars of the abbey palace, built in 1727. Perfect facsimiles of manuscripts such as the Codex Epternacensis that were produced in the scriptorium at Echternach are on display here. The Abbey Museum also gives an insight into the life and work of Saint Willibrord, who founded the Abbey of Echternach in the year 698; and his bones rest in the crypt of the basilica. The Hopping Procession that is now on the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage list also dates back to the time of Willibrord.

Hihof Prehistoric Museum: the development of mankind

The Hihof Museum, housed in a medieval building, explains the development of mankind from the Paleolithic era to the first farmers.

Artefacts from all over the world show how tools and weapons developed over a period of more than a million years. Chronological charts, maps and films bring the Stone Age to life. The most important exhibit is a copy of the skeleton of Loschbour man, known as “Loschi”.

The 8000-year-old skeleton was found beside the Löschbur stream near Heffingen; “Loschi” is Luxembourg’s oldest resident!

Gallo-Roman Villa of Echternach

The castles of Larochette

Two castles tower over this area and dominate the picturesque little town of Larochette (Fels in German). The buildings of the fortified castle, which dates back to before the 12th century, are perched on a promontory of Luxembourg sandstone, about 150m above the valley of the White Ernz, a tributary of the river Sûre. The oldest part of the castle is the Homburg Manor. It fell victim to a huge fire in 1565 and is still in ruins today. The Créhangé Manor is the only building that has so far been fully restored. Temporary art exhibitions fill its historic walls with life. The many footpaths and mountain biking routes in the area offer excellent views over the whole castle complex.

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MORE THINGS TO DO MÜLLERTHAL

Fascinating geology, extensive views and "Leading Quality Trails"

The Mullerthal region is a paradise for **walkers**. Famed well beyond the country's borders is the 112km **Mullerthal Trail**. Three routes run through a fascinating, and sometimes rocky, landscape. The main trail is one of the "Leading Quality Trails – Best of Europe", a certification awarded by the European Ramblers Association. Depending on the section and route, the Mullerthal Trail is suitable both for beginners and for experienced walkers. The **three routes** each have their own character:

Route 1 offers the landscape elements

typical of the region - rock, forest and meadows - in addition to cultural features. **Route 2** runs through the heart of "Luxembourg's Little Switzerland", taking the walker to the most spectacular rock formations.

Route 3 is characterised primarily, in addition to rocks, by magical river valleys and romantic castles. The routes are connected with one another but can also be walked individually. As the trails can be joined at several points, they can be configured as you please. In addition, the Mullerthal Trail is supplemented by four "ExtraTours",

which are similarly very attractive walking routes. They can be taken on either as beginners' walks or as supplementary tours, if the other routes have already been explored. We recommend the regional walking map and the Mullerthal Trail Pocket Guide, available online and in the region's tourist information offices.

When travelling in the Mullerthal region, the **Heringer Millen Tourist Centre** in the village of Mullerthal is well worth a visit. This restored flour mill, dating from the 17th century, houses a museum, together with one of the “Best of Wandern” test centres that are found across Europe, where all visitors are welcome to borrow high-quality walking equipment (boots, jackets, rucksacks, binoculars, etc.) free of charge. In addition, visitors will find information materials there, along with regional products, traditional picnic baskets or practical picnic rucksacks, and a restaurant. For walkers, the kitchen is open throughout the centre's opening hours, and you can refill your water bottle at the tap.

The “**Kuelscheier**” is a group of rocks with a special attraction right at its heart: a pitch-dark, narrow tunnel through the rock, around 100 metres long, enclosed at the top. In some places, it is so narrow that “one-way traffic” is the only way to get through. You'll need a torch with you to explore it on the “**Adventure Kuelscheier**” guided tour. Other bizarre rock formations on this route are the narrow passages of the “Rittergang” and “Déiwepëtz”. Length: 3.5 km.

Bike and e-bike riders can look forward to thrilling tours through the countryside or along pleasant routes beside the Sûre river as it runs along the border. Scenic tours: Berdorf-Consdorf–Bech Cliff Route > 43 km; Rosport-Mompach-Echternach Tudor Tour > 43 km. Sixteen racing bike tours with widely-varying degrees of difficulty and elevation profiles have been devised in collaboration with the local cycling club, Mullerthal Cycling. There are five mountain bike trails. Eleven “Rent-a-Bike” hire points offer a repair service seven days a week. In addition, there is a luggage forwarding service (page 95).

Extensive, wonderfully attractive views, fascinating rock formations, impressive culture and history: you are welcome to explore the region conveniently by **car, motorbike or coach**. At **Mullerthal Touring**, you will find six suggested tours for this.

The “**Schiessentümpel**” is a picturesque waterfall on the Black Ernz river. The water shoots over a rock edge in three streams, tumbling into a rock basin below. The name Schiessentümpel as used today refers to both the bridge and the waterfall. The sandstone bridge was built in 1879, and since then has been the symbol of the region. You reach the Schiessentümpel either via a short walk on foot, around 1 km starting from the Heringer Millen Tourist Centre on local paths (W6 & W7), or from the nearby, larger car park between the village of Mullerthal and the Breidweiler Bridge junction on the CR121. You can walk along the road or take the Mullerthal Trail Route 3, heading towards Mullerthal. Here, a new highlight awaits the visitor: a 90 metre-long construction of steps in steel and local wood, opened in 2019, attached to the ground by 16 supports and anchored directly into the rock by seven fastenings.

The unique geological heritage of imposing sandstone rocks with narrow gaps and deep gorges make the region something very special. You can see this at the **Natur- a Geopark Mëllerdall**, where the focus is on the nature and the fascinating geology of the region. The combination of nature park and geopark underlines the special importance and need to protect a landscape which should be preserved for future generations. The park offers a range of activities to discover the region: educational initiatives such as information boards, guided walks and leaflets help in understanding the geological aspects. The Natur- a Geopark Mëllerdall is a candidate for a UNESCO Global Geopark accreditation.

If you fancy a glimpse into the ancient past, don’t skip a visit to the **Roman villa and museum**. At the **youth hostel**, right by the lake, you can eat in the restaurant and enjoy its terrace. The lakeside area also regularly stages a variety of **events**.

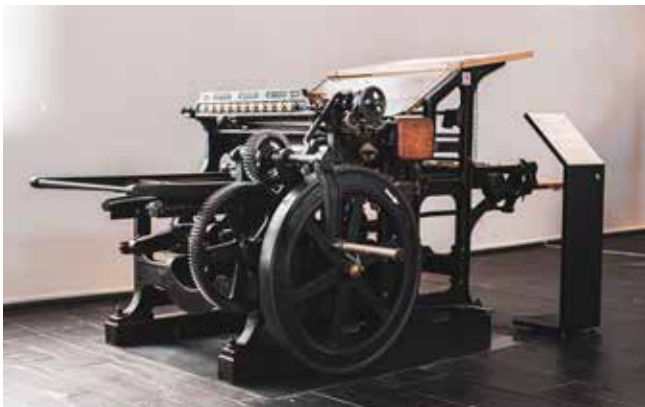

Caves St Martin: underground wine paradise

If you are following Luxembourg's Wine Route, you must visit the prestigious Caves St Martin winery just outside Remich, known as the "Pearl of the Moselle". Take a guided tour, including wine tasting, during which you will walk to the heart of the underground tunnels – nearly a kilometre long – that have been carved into the solid limestone rock. After exploring the wine-tasting cellar and shop, you can relax on the terrace overlooking the Moselle. Admire the panorama! The Moselle region has some magnificent **viewpoints**. For instance, between Stadtbredimus and Greiveldange, on the Scheierberg in Remich, from the top of the most famous Moselle vineyard, Koeppchen, or at one of the most photographed places along the Moselle, the Deisermillen in Machtum.

The Moselle is a **paradise for nature-lovers**. Visit the former gravel pits at **Remerschen/Wintrange**, with the futuristically-designed Biodiversum Centre in the Haff-Réimech nature

reserve (page 122), a marshland area of European significance due to the wide variety of species found there. Two nature trails with observation cabins enable you to discover fauna and flora up close.

Another nature reserve in the Moselle region is “**A Wiewesch**” in Manternach. It is surrounded by fruit orchards, and only a few hundred metres away from the Manternacher Fels nature reserve, where you can marvel at the biggest wooded gorge in the Grand Duchy. The many paths and themed walks organised by the

nature reserve centre invite you to discover the diverse countryside.

At the Moselle, you can also **enjoy outstanding walks** – on premium routes such as the three dream loops off the “Saar-Hunsrück-Steig” hiking path, guaranteeing unforgettable circular walks on foot through the region.

The average-difficulty “**Manternacher Fiels**” route runs through the nature reserve of the same name, past an impressive forested canyon, through gigantic stratifications of rock and the narrow Kerbtal valley. En route, you will be treated with wonderful panoramic views on the Lelliger Plateau, and a vineyard in the heart of a forest.

Schengen without Borders starts in the village on the Moselle that became famous with the signing of the Schengen Agreement in 1985, and which stands for a Europe without borders. The walk leads from the European Museum to the “Stromberg” nature reserve, and onwards towards France in the area around the winegrowing village of Contz-les-Bains. Magnificent views into the Moselle valley, sloping vineyards,

extensive panoramic views towards Luxembourg and France’s Lorraine region, and the untamed nature of the Stromberg make this walk a memorable experience.

The dream loop route “**Palmberg Ahn Wine & Nature Path**”, starting from the small winemaking village of Ahn, offers a great combination for walkers. It runs past the inclined limestone rock strata and through the sloping vineyards of the Palmberg, with magnificent views over the Moselle valley below. After walking through forests rich in diversity of species, you reach a nature reserve with a stock of ancient boxwood and meadows full of orchids. The final section runs through the Donverbach valley, with its waterfalls and a wooded gorge.

Of course, in this **region famous for its wine and sparkling wine (Crémant de Luxembourg)**, a particular recommendation on any tour is to **stop off** at one of the many **private winemakers**. In the Moselle valley and in the foothills, there are also plenty of **restaurants** with a traditional cuisine based on locally-sourced products, offering guests a sophisticated yet authentic gastronomy. Trout in Riesling sauce, fried fish that you eat with your fingers, and crayfish à la luxembourgeoise rank amongst the greatest of culinary specialities from the region. Those restaurants with the “Ambassadeurs” label are official representatives for Luxembourg wines and crémants, and offer a wide selection of vin-

tages. Varieties of schnapps, juices, jams, honey, pastries and sausages are also produced in the Moselle region, and all are well worth trying. See for yourself, in one of the many regional restaurants or at the weekly and monthly fresh produce markets in Schengen, Remich, Grevenmacher and Mondorf-les-Bains.

Blast furnaces in the City of Science

Minett Park Fond-de-Gras: steam train rides and a glimpse of mining

Nowadays, it's hard to imagine that the peaceful little valley of Fond-de-Gras was, until the 1960s, one of the country's leading mining centres. At the Minett Park Fond-de-Gras, over 100 years of industrial history in the south of Luxembourg are brought vividly to life. The Train 1900 steam train links Pétange with Fond-de-Gras just as it used to around the turn of the last century. The “Minièresbunn” miners' train takes visitors through a tunnel where iron ore used to be extracted, from Fond-de-Gras to the mining village of Lasauvage and as far as Saulnes (in France). In summer, the Blues Express music festival and the Steampunk Convention make this open-air museum rock!

Life on the land: the Rural and Artisanal Museum

What was life in the countryside like nearly 200 years ago? This museum is housed in an old farm built in 1840 and shows what working on a farm was like, along with many former village craftsmen's workshops. You can also see a number of examples of agricultural machinery and furniture from the 19th century. Visitors are guided round by an audio tour. There's a playground for children and a welcoming café-restaurant where visitors can go to enjoy some local specialities.

Underground at the National Mining Museum

Travel around underground like a miner! To enter the mine, visitors travel, just like the workers did, on the mine railway for about 20 minutes. Then they continue on foot. On the way, a museum guide explains all about the work of the men who used to spend the whole day in the underground tunnels. Most of the museum's collection is housed in the actual mine, so the tools and machines are displayed in their natural environment, so to speak, and bear witness to over 100 years of technical progress in iron ore mining. The tours of the mine last about 1.5 hours and are always for groups, escorted by a museum guide.

MORE THINGS TO DO LAND OF THE RED ROCKS

On the Minett Tour between past and present

Want to learn all about the exciting industrial history of the Land of the Red Rocks? Then go on the **Minett Tour** (www.minett-tour.lu). This route, roughly 35km long, links five sites with various thematic focuses associated with mining for iron ore and steel manufacturing. In addition to the **Minett-Park Fond-de-Gras** presented earlier (page 150), the tour also features the following places:

The restored **blast furnaces in Belval/Esch-sur-Alzette** (page 149) lie at the heart of the City of

Science, comprising the modern university and business site. To discover more, guided tours take you inside the furnace and on an ascent to a viewing platform with fantastic views over the site and its surrounding area.

In Esch-sur-Alzette, the **Cockerill Mine Museum** invites you to dive into the world of the miners, thanks to a rich collection of tools and a committed group of volunteers who are preserving the working life of the Katzenberg pit - which only shut in 1967 - for

future generations. Guided tours are available.

The **National Mining Museum** (page 153) is located in Rumelange. The traditional viewing tour starts with a ride on a mine railway. This crosses the above-ground slag heap and enters the mine via the Langengrund gallery. The museum's collection comprises machinery, equipment and archive documents relating to iron ore mining in Luxembourg from the middle of the 19th century through to the 1980s.

The **Human Migration Documentation Centre** (CDMH) in Dudelange conveys a sense of how greatly society has been influenced by the country's steel history. In fact, very many miners came from abroad, especially from Portugal and Italy. From the impressive water tower in **Dudelange** (page 144), walk through the former workers' district of the **Italian Quarter** and then on through the nature reserve, on the trail of the steel industry. En route, you will discover what a "Humpen" is.

In the small, sleepy village of **Lasauvage** on the French border, there is plenty of industrial history to marvel at. This former mining village is today home to silent witnesses of earlier times, such as the overhead pylons for what used to be the mine train (the "Minièresbunn"), old bridges and sheds. In Lasauvage, you will also find two museums. With a little luck, you can even find out about the legend from which the village gets its name. Incidentally, on certain days you can even ride the **Minièresbunn** from here to the Minett Park Fond-de-Gras.

On the "**Sentier de la Crosnière**" hiking trail, in the vicinity of Lasauvage, families will discover a true insider's tip: a place where children can discover nature through play. Helpful information boards guide them along the trail, a little over 3km in length. In addition to this trail, there are also other hiking routes to explore.

The former mining area of "**Prënzeberg – Giele Botter**" is well-suited to being explored on foot or by mountain bike. During

the industrial age, it looked more like a clearance cutting operation than a natural environment here; the dominant colour was the red of the rock formations which held the sought-after iron ore within them. Once mining operations ended, however, another colour again moved into what today is a nature reserve: the green of self-seeded trees and newly-established biotopes brought into being a place of contrasts. When new conservation areas emerge from the “lunar landscape”, when nature again clings fast to land from which she was previously driven out, then the result is unique, impressive areas of landscape.

The **Titelberg** is a plateau site in the commune of Pétange. It was inhabited during the Iron Age and in Roman times; the evidence of this is numerous archaeological finds from various centuries. The Late Celtic and early provincial Roman oppidum dates from the heyday of the settlement there.

Those who like to undertake a journey of discovery into nature

under their own steam and with a quest for knowledge will feel they have struck gold at the **Ellergronn nature reserve** and Nature Centre. There are six circular routes around the reserve, three of which are part of the European Natura 2000 network. Whether it is the 2.5 km route well-suited to families with small children, the 4.5 km themed route focusing on ore mining in the region, or the 5 km route through the forest, the diversity of the walking routes is a repeated invitation to wander through the biotope. Particularly keen walkers can combine all three routes together, making one long loop of twelve kilometres. The nature reserve, with its specifically-designated paths, is equally well-suited to **mountain bikers**, who – with or without a guide – can experience a true outdoor industrial heritage adventure here: passing old mine entrances, wagons, the relics of a cable-car or erstwhile rail tracks. Like all mountain bike routes in the region, what's offered at Ellergronn is aimed firmly at experienced riders; for those who like to undertake their journey of discovery in a group, it is also possible to do this with a personal guide.

The **RedRock MTB Trails** guide mountain bikers, amongst other places, through the nature reserves in the Minett region presented here. There are the **Ellergronn**, **Haard-Black** and **Haard-Red** trails, the **Weiler-la-Tour** route, the **Belvaux-Differdange** and **Lalléngerbi-erg-Gaalgebierg** trail. Riders master thrilling courses, whilst seeing the former industrial region in a new light. That said, the terrain demands the fullest concentration and physical effort from riders – the protected nature reserves, formed by human hands and reclaimed by nature, present a challenging environment. Similar fun can be had on the pump tracks in **Mondercange** or **Belval**.

Families can discover a further highlight of the region on the **Gaalgebierg** hill, in close proximity to the town centre of Esch-sur-Alzette: around 25 animal species of can be visited the whole year round in the “**Escher Déierepark**”, including the roe deer, raccoon and Poitou donkey. On the “**Heemelwee**” path, children can stroke the animals. There is a chance to relax in the “**Bamhaus-café**”, and for those who have always wanted to spend a night close to their animal friends there is a back-to-nature shelter in the “**Escher**

Bamhaiser” – right in the zoo, in a treehouse style. Visiting the park is free, and in the winter months you can let off steam here on a weather-proof, sustainable ice rink.

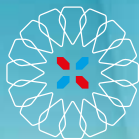
